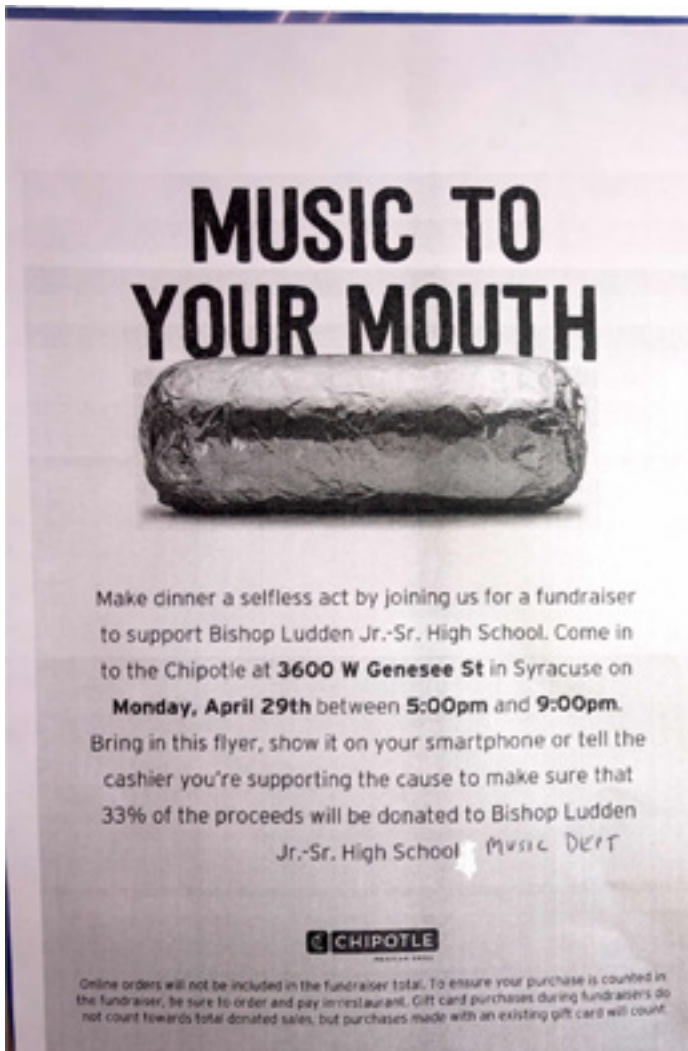

IB INFO

Bishop Ludden is currently a candidate school for authorization to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (DP). Once the authorization period is successfully completed, we can anticipate offering IB courses starting September, 2020.

The IB Diploma Programme (IB DP) includes at least one course from each of six subject areas: English Literature, Second Language, Individuals & Societies, Science, Mathematics, and the Arts. The IB DP also has unique Core requirements, which include a class called Theory of Knowledge (TOK), a program of Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS), and a major research project called the Extended Essay (EE). While students are guided to take pre-diploma courses in grades nine and 10, their actual IB DP courses start in grade 11, and extend through grade 12. (This effectively ends any idea of “senioritis” in the senior year...)

But what does any of this mean to college applications and admissions?

College and university response to IB DP candidates is not uniform. College reaction can range from awarding full sophomore status to a DP student, to no recognition for IB classes at all. (That reaction is becoming very rare.) There are two considerations here: the actual, final performance of the student, and the policy of the selected college.

Typically, students begin taking entrance exams and looking seriously at specific colleges during their junior year. By the time they actually send out college applications, they likely will have completed a year of IB coursework, and can include in their applications that they are “IB Diploma Programme candidates,” meaning they are on track to completing all the requirements for the IB DP.

Keep in mind, though, that to be awarded the IB Diploma at the end of the senior year, a student must accumulate at least 24 total points, within a few other guidelines. So, a student who earns a 4 in each of the six IB courses is off to a great start, since 6×4 is 24. BUT DP students must also:

- Complete all three Core components with passing grades, which can add up to 3 additional points
- Have no course score of 1
- Have no more than two course scores of 2
- Have no more than three scores of 3
- Score at least 12 points combined from the three HL courses
- Score at least 9 points combined from the three SL courses

Any IB Diploma Programme student entering the senior year is an IB DP candidate. If that student completes all DP requirements, the student is IB Diploma eligible. If enough points are earned, the student is conferred the actual IB Diploma.

Colleges and universities respond to IB DP in differing ways. If a student is actually conferred the IB Diploma, there are colleges that will allow the student to enter as a college sophomore, who are immediately granted 30 college credits, and who can then finish a bachelor’s degree in three years instead of four. This is equal to a free year of college expenses.

Other colleges will allow college credit for some of the individual IB courses, assuming a certain minimum grade was achieved. There are many colleges that will even recognize and award college credit for students who were diploma eligible, but did not earn quite enough points to be conferred the actual IB diploma. Students who are not full IB diploma students but choose to take fewer IB courses may also receive college credit for those courses, provided their scores are acceptable to the college in question.

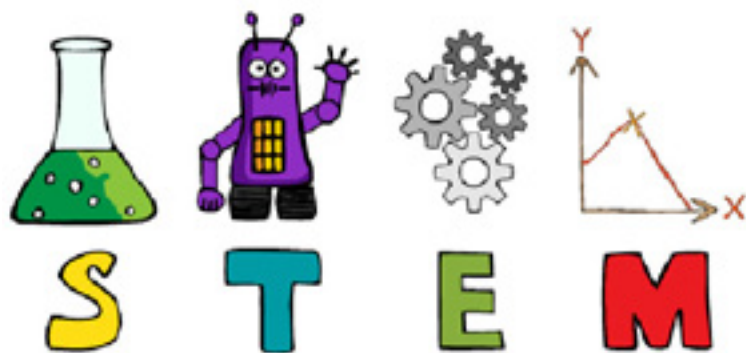
How can you know where to look and how to choose?

Bishop Ludden's guidance counselors will help provide information on those colleges that are most receptive to the IB DP. Counselors receive professional training on how to help students make the most of their IB DP experience as they progress toward college level work. That training also includes powerful networking opportunities among counselors from across the country, to share the experiences of their students as they encounter and explore colleges' responses to their IB credentials, and reporting on those that accept IB credentials best.

College preparation via the IB DP is indisputably effective: IB DP students excel in their first year of college because they arrive so well-prepared for higher level work. By choosing a college or university strategically, a student may also enjoy the financial benefits of college credit awarded for work well done.
