

BL Team A claims 3rd at 2023 Ithaca Fall Invitational



Bishop Ludden took four teams to the Ithaca Fall Invitational Quiz Bowl Tournament and brought home the third-place trophy and two All-Star awards. Ludden's A team went 6-1 during the seven preliminary rounds, losing only to eventual champions Berwick A. The squad went to the championship round, winning the first two games and then fell by one question to Geneva A in Round 10. Captain Payton Campbell, Peter Smith, the tournament's top overall player, Alex Ewanyk, and Theresa Quigley defeated Berwick B, the only squad to beat Berwick A, in round 11 for the thirdplace trophy. Berwick A, at 10-1, took the championship trophy with a win over 10-1 Geneva A.

Bishop Ludden A beat Moravia 255-110, Geneva B 275-70, Bishop Ludden C 215-70, Union Springs B 375-30, Hopkins B 260 -130, and then went into game six against 5-0 Cooperstown A. The team smoked Cooperstown 305-90. The six-game streak ended with a 315-135 loss to Berwick A. The team was seeded third going into playoffs and beat Hopkins A 240-90 and Geneva B 215-130 before taking on Geneva A in Game 10. The game had

constant lead changes before Geneva locked in the win on question 19 out of 20. BL A took 45 points on question 20, but the 250-230 margin sent Geneva to the championship finals. Bishop Ludden A then faced Berwick B, which came off defeating eventual champs Berwick A 185-145 in round 10. Bishop Ludden A pulled away on question 17 for the 230-100 victory. The squad had very balanced scoring throughout the day as they worked towards nationals in the spring. Peter averaged 67.27 per game, followed by rising star Alex Ewanyk with 16.36. Alex's first guiz bowl was in September. Captain Payton Campbell and Theresa Quigley averaged 10 and 9.55 respectively. Bishop Ludden B's squad, Captains Julia Smith and Zander Craner, Molly Smith, and Aidan Grealish-Liquori were 2-5 in prelims, before a 2-1 performance in the consolation round, where they defeated Union Springs A and Moravia.

Bishop Ludden C had two wins on the day. The squad was led by senior Captain Lily Janowski, who averaged 23 points per game, Gabriella Berry, who averaged 11.5, Mary Papini, with 11.01, Sophia Azria with 5.0, and Noor Naveed.

Bishop Ludden D finished in sixth place with their 6-4 record. The team was led by All-Star Momin Naveed, with 36.50 points per game and Mya Barnaba with 23 per game. Captains Ryan Skanes and Olivia Smith averaged 10.5 and 5.71 respectively, with eighth grader Asimwe Kabulete scoring in the bonus section, which is not credited individually. They opened with a pair of one question victories, a 175-150 nipping of Hopkins A and 160-125 victory over Cooperstown B. They dropped a 105-70 game to Bishop Ludden B, then rebounded to defeat Skaneateles 250-95. They dropped the next two games to Geneva A and Berwick B before smacking Union Springs A 160-35. They just missed qualifying for the Championship round and were 2-1 in Consolation. They destroyed Union Springs B 210-10, dropped to Cooperstown B 205-85, then finished with a 170-50 drubbing of Bishop Ludden C.

The teams travel to Geneva on December 2 for the Geneva Invitational.



GIFTS OF CASH

Cash and checks of any amount are welcome. Please make checks payable to Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School.

GIFTS OF PUBLICLY TRADED SECURITIES

All securities that are traded on the New York and American Stock Exchanges, the NASDAQ, and other major U.S. Exchanges shall be accepted. The value of a gift of regularly traded securities will be the mean of the high and low of the stock(s) or bond(s) on the day the transfer is affected by the donor to the organization.

GIFTS BY BEQUEST

Cash bequests represent an important potential source of gifts. Direct, unencumbered bequests provide Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School the full value of the bequest and provide the testator's estate with a charitable deduction for the same value. Attempts shall be made to discover bequest plans whenever possible in order to determine whether inappropriate non-cash items have inadvertently been left to the organization so the donor can be advised how to conform his or her plans to Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School.

There are four ways that a bequest can be made to Bishop Ludden $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Jr}}\xspace/\mathsf{Sr}$ High School:

- A fixed amount of cash or securities or a percentage of the estate can be given.
- In a residual bequest, after other beneficiaries receive a designated portion of the estate, the remainder of the estate is left to Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School.
- 3. A contingent bequest can be made where Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School will receive a portion of the estate only if the named beneficiaries predecease the maker of the bequest. Those who must provide for younger family members often select this form.
- 4. A testamentary trust bequest creates a trust and the income or stated amount is paid to the beneficiaries. On their death, Bishop Ludden Jr Sr High School receives the use of the gift. This option may actually increase life income for beneficiaries since it reduces the amount of the estate subject to estate taxes.

DIRECT GIFTS FROM INDIVIDUAL RETIREMENT ACCOUNT

Donors who are ages 70% or older can instruct their plan administrators to make direct transfers of up to \$100,000 to Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School. The gift will count towards the donor's minimum distribution requirement. The gift is not included in taxable income, and no charitable deduction is allowed.

GIFTS BY LIFE INSURANCE

Life insurance may be given to the organization. Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School encourages donors to name the organization to receive all or a portion of the benefits of life insurance policies that they have purchased on their lives. New or existing policies may be given outright or the organization can be named the owner and beneficiary of an existing policy.

Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School will accept fully paid life insurance policies in which the donor has named the organization to receive all or a portion of the benefits of the insurance policy. The donor's tax consequences hinge on whether the policy's ownership has been endorsed over to the organization and whether the benefits have been irrevocably assigned to Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School.

A donor who irrevocably transfers life insurance to Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School can claim income tax deductions for the policy's cost basis or cash surrender value, whichever is less. The donor can never claim an income tax deduction on the policy's face value.

Naming Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School as the beneficiary on the policy is not sufficient to generate an income tax deduction for the donor because the donor can change the beneficiary at a later date. To be entitled to a deduction, the donor must make the organization both beneficiary and owner of the policy. Upon receiving a paid-up policy, the organization, as owner, can surrender it and obtain the cash value or keep the policy until the death of the donor.

GIFTS BY CHARITABLE REMAINDER TRUSTS

Charitable Remainder Trusts are separate legal entities, and their obligations are limited to their assets. Trusts file their own returns and make all payments from their assets and must have a federal trust number, making payments to beneficiaries under strictly hierarchical rules.
