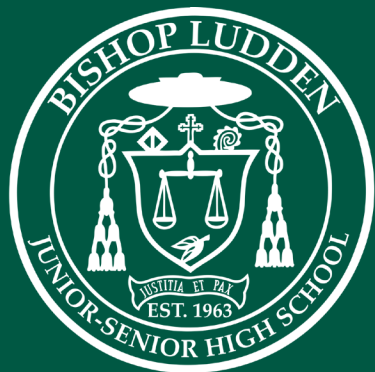

CALENDAR

The school year is divided into four marking periods of approximately nine weeks in length. The school day is divided into eight class periods of 42 minutes each. We operate on a two-day cycle with all major subject (English, Social Studies, Math, Science, Foreign Language and Religion) meeting every day. Students take mid-term and final exams at the end of each semester.

HONORS DIPLOMA

A student earns a computed average of at least 90 on the Regents examinations applicable to either a Regents Diploma or a Regents Diploma with Advance Designation.

MASTER IN MATH/SCIENCE

A student meets all requirements for a Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation AND earns a score of 85 or better on 3 math/science Regents exams
