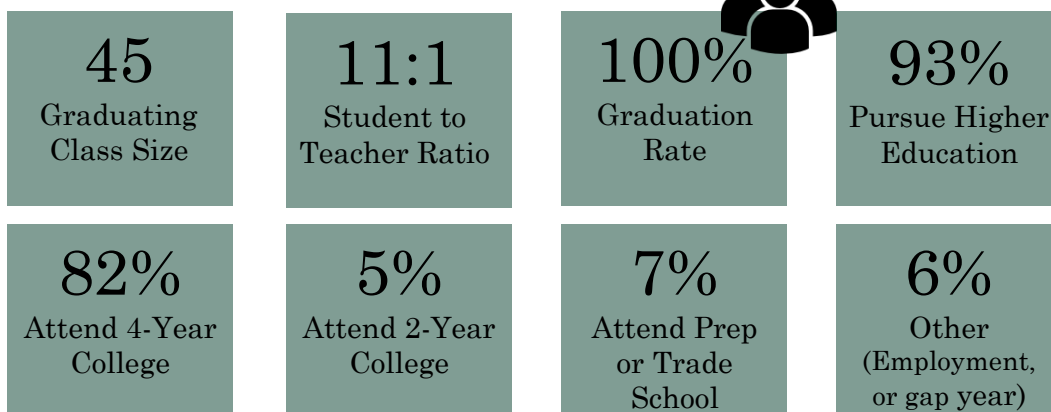
## Calendar

- 4% of the scores were 6 or 7

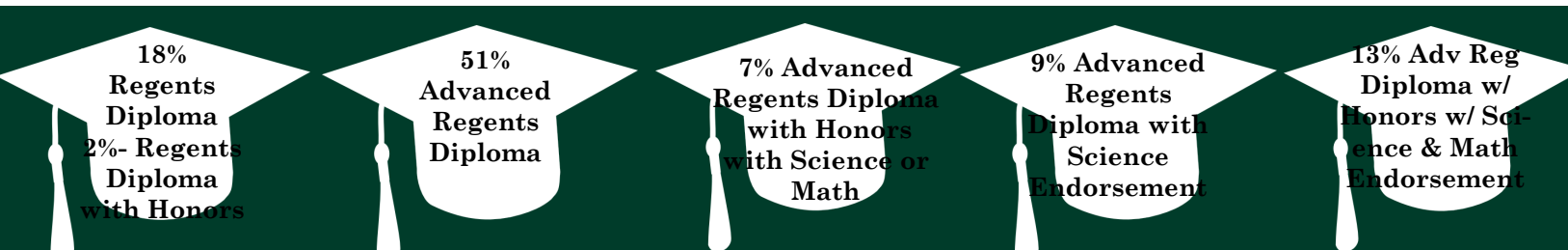
### AP DATA (scores range from 1-5)

- In the 2020-21 school year, 49 students in grades 10-12 took 53 AP exams in 2 subject areas
- 43% of the scores were 3 or higher
- 11% of the scores were 4 or higher

### NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

In the second semester of their junior year, students who have a five semester cumulative average of 90% or higher are academically qualified to apply for induction into Bishop Ludden's National Honor Society, Lumen Christi Chapter. Students must also demonstrate leadership, character and service to the school and community.

**\*Honors:** A student earns a computed average of at least 90 on the Regents examination applicable to either a Regents diploma or a Regents diploma with advanced designation.

**\*Mastery in Math/Science:** A student meets all the requirements for a Regents diploma with advanced designation AND earns a score of 85 or better on 3 math/science Regents exams
